

Planner Monthly Report

Planner reported the NRPC will meet November 8th. The LUPB meets November 15th. The LUPB continues work on the Land Use Plan revision with current focus on the chapter dealing with Land Use Policies. Final reports for Phases 1 and 2 of the Brownfields Study at the old airport site have been received. The results were as expected and the reports contained a list of remediation projects the necessity for which will depend on what future uses may be selected for the site. Copies of the reports are available from the County Planner. Field work on the WPLI was completed this summer and meetings have resumed this fall. WPLI Committee recommendations are anticipated in the next few months. Due to the lack of support from Red Lane residents, the Red Lane Groundwater study has been deferred. Grant funds will be transferred to another groundwater study project if possible or the money will be returned to the State.

Youth Alternatives Monthly Report

Youth Alternatives Director Barb Rice reported four male and seven female program participants this month. There are two people under community service facilitation and three families being assisted with home visits/support. The Alive at 25 Class held last month had nine out-of-county participants and one local participant. Mrs. Rice noted that the upcoming holiday season offers many opportunities for Community Service projects for program participants.

Vision Source Signature Eye Care 20/20 Savings Program

Chief Deputy Clerk Karen Slocum presented an eye care savings program offered by the local eye care provider in lieu of the VSP insurance program no longer accepted at Thermopolis Eye Care. There is no cost to the county or the employees and the program offers 20% off all services except the purchase of contact lenses. Tom Ryan moved to approve the Chairman's signature on the enrollment form to make the Vision Source Signature Eye Care 20/20 Savings Program available to all County employees. Phillip Scheel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Homeland Security Grant – Sheriff

Sheriff Falgoust presented the State Homeland Security Program Grant for the Commissioners' review. This grant covers the purchase of equipment such as AED's, ballistic armor, cameras and metal detectors. Tom Ryan moved to accept the State Homeland Security Program Grant for the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$20,330.00 for the period of September 1, 2017 through March 31, 2020. Phillip Scheel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Hot Springs County Joint Powers Board – Big Horn Regional Water JPB

Following a presentation by Neil Miller of the South Thermopolis Water & Sewer District, Phillip Scheel moved to draft a letter to STWSD agreeing in principle to participate in the formation of a joint powers board to work with the Big Horn Regional Water Joint Powers Board to provide a source of good, safe water at a reasonable price to various entities in Hot Springs County, with Tom Ryan to serve as the County's representative on the board. Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Discussion: If the board is formed, the estimated \$200.00/month cost per entity would come from Emergency Expenditures until the next budget is set. Motion carried.

Other Business

Pinnacle Bank/Public Funds Depository – Phillip Scheel moved to approve Pinnacle Bank's application and accompanying resolution to act as a depository for County funds. Tom Ryan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Part-Time Assistant Public Defender – The Commissioners reviewed the appointment of Lindsey Krause as a part-time Assistant Public Defender for the Fifth Judicial District. No action was required.

Title 25 Pool Discussion – After discussion with the Sheriff's Office personnel, it was decided not to establish a pool of agents to supervise Title 25 patients admitted to the hospital due to liability concerns. The Sheriff agreed to notify the hospital that his personnel will respond to provide supervision as needed for all Title 25 patients brought in to the hospital, regardless of which agency initially brought the patient to the hospital.
